The Academic Assembly of the School of Business Administration affirms this Code of Ethics as the behavioral principles that advance the school's values and mission.

Respectfulness

We will hold ourselves, and each other person, with high regard and with compassionate consideration for their circumstances; acknowledging the inherent value in each human being; honoring the rights of others to be treated with dignity; and seeking to foster a spirit of civility and collegiality through open and honest communication.

Honesty

We will interact with others in a fair and straightforward manner; telling the truth and not intentionally misleading or providing inaccurate information; and demanding the absence of fraud or deceit in ourselves and others with whom we interact.

Responsibility

We will be accountable for the foreseeable consequences of our actions, reactions, choices, and goals; demonstrating an active commitment to the responsibilities we assume and to the welfare of others; and being mindful of the importance of serving as a role model.

Academic Freedom

We will act in ways that reflect and promote our commitment to the pursuit of truth, intellectual curiosity and academic freedom.

Professionalism

We will comply with the standards and requirements that are applicable to the academic, research, administrative and other aspects of our School, including University and governmental requirements pertaining to interpersonal conduct, research ethics, academic integrity, workplace ethics, and diversity.

Integrity

We shall consistently act in ways that reflect our faithfulness to our professed values and ideals, unimpeded by conflicts of interest, as we seek to be beyond reproach and to avoid both the fact and the appearance of impropriety.
