



As an undergraduate non-business major, our business minor offers you a terrific opportunity to broaden your understanding of business principles and practices you'll encounter throughout your career, no matter your field of expertise. As a business minor, you'll develop a working knowledge of accounting, finance, management and marketing that will make you more competitive within your field. Additionally, by completing the business minor, you will have a head start toward the completion of a WSU master of business administration (M.B.A.) degree should you choose to further your studies in business.

Undergraduate students with a declared major in any discipline other than business who have a minimum 2.5 GPA are eligible to apply for a business minor.

PREREQUISITE COURSES

Students are required to complete each of the following courses with a minimum 2.0 GPA (C grade). It is recommended, but not required, that these courses be completed prior to beginning the business minor:

- BA 2300**Qualitative Methods I
- ECO 2010**Principles of Microeconomics
- ECO 2020**Principles of Macroeconomics

REQUIRED COURSES

The business minor consists of six courses, totaling 18 credit hours, in the Mike Ilitch School of Business. Students are required to complete each course with a minimum 2.0 GPA (C grade). Courses included in the business minor are designed to provide the non-business major with a broad introduction to business disciplines. The courses also allow a waiver of some of the graduate foundation courses for students interested in pursuing an M.B.A. at Wayne State University.

- ACC 3010**Introduction to Financial Accounting
- MGT 2530**Management of Organizational Behavior (PSY 1010 or PSY 1020 is a pre-requisite for MGT 2530)
- MKT 2300**Marketing Management

Plus one of the following:

- FIN 3290**Business Finance
- GSC 3600**Operations and Supply Chain Management
- ISM 3630**Business Information Systems

***Minimum 9 credit hours of required courses must be completed at Wayne State University**

ELECTIVES

Two elective classes provide you with the flexibility to pursue business courses that are of particular interest to you. You are encouraged to talk with your business school advisor about your elective options, which may include any elective course in the Mike Ilitch School of Business for which you satisfy the prerequisite requirements. If you believe you will be pursuing an M.B.A. after receiving your bachelor's degree, then consider selecting GSC 3600 as one of your electives.
